This dance pattern originated in Spain in the early 17th century and gradually became popular around Europe as the Baroque period progressed.

The organist at Notre Dame de Paris, Louis Vierne wrote Carillon de Westminster (published 1927) for his friend, noted English organbuilder Henry Willis, who suggested the famous Westminster Clock chimes from the Houses of Parliament as a good subject. Willis must have hummed the tune incorrectly, because you will hear that some of the notes are in the wrong order. The piece builds from a distant start into a raucous finish with full organ engaged.
