

#### OPENING VOLUNTARY Choral, Op. 37 no. 4

Joseph Jongen (1873-1953)

Belgian composer Jongen wrote a lot of music for the organ. His epic Sonata Eroica is well-known and loved by many organists, and his Symphonie Concertante written in 1926 is considered by many to be among the greatest works ever written for organ and orchestra. This Choral starts gently on the swell foundations and builds throughout the piece to an almighty climax on the full organ. If you listen carefully, you will hear a canon between the melody in the right hand and the pedals for much of the piece. While the harmonic language starts in a fairly simple way, it thickens in texture and becomes more rich as the piece continues.

## We Hear God's Word

#### \*THE GOSPEL LESSON Matthew 25:31-46

# ALL: 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup> And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup> And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?'

One: <sup>40</sup> And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' <sup>41</sup> Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; <sup>42</sup> for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, <sup>43</sup> I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' <sup>44</sup> Then they also will answer,


