Christ, unser Herr, zum Jordan kam ("Christ our Lord came to the Jordan"), BWV 685

J.S. Bach (1685-1750)

This music comes from the collection of chorale preludes known as the Clavier-Übung Part III (Part I comprises the keyboard partitas, Part II contains the Italian concerto and French Overture, and Part IV is better known as the Goldberg Variations). In this collection, Bach sets each chorale in both a larger version with manuals and pedals and a smaller version for the keyboards alone. This setting of *Christ unser Herr* is the latter: while its larger counterpart depicts the bubbling water of the Jordan River in which Jesus was baptized, this chorale prelude is a more subdued three-part fughetta, based on the first notes of the chorale tune.

# Mark 1:4-11

<sup>4</sup> John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.



# Christ, unser Herr, zum Jordan kam, P. 61

Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706)

Immensely talented even beyond his famous Canon in D, Johann Pachelbel was one of the preeminent German organists and composers of the Baroque era. Born in Nuremburg, he was Lutheran but was exposed to Catholic church music traditions whilst studying in Vienna. Many of Pachelbel's organ works are chorale preludes, wherein the cantus firmus (chorale melody) is treated with imitation phrase by phrase. In this setting of the same chorale heard in our prelude, you will hear the chorale melody in the strong pedal part, underneath figuration in the manuals.
