Dr. Melissa Dunphy is an Australian-American composer based in Philadelphia. While she is known for larger scale works, such as opera and chamber music, Dunphy has written a simple, gentle setting of the chant known as the Advent Prose ("Drop down ye heavens from above, And let the skies pour down righteousness...") for the quieter sounds of the organ. You will hear the chant tune shared and imitated between two voices in the hands, while the pedal provides a soft accompaniment.


