**OPENING VOLUNTARY** 

Communion, Op. 8

Louis Vierne (1870-1937)

This beautiful, early work of Vierne's was published in the anthology *Album d'auteurs modernes* (Album of Modern Authors) by Abbot Henri Haze, published in 1894, before Vierne took up the reins as organist at Notre Dame cathedral in Paris. This music is ethereal and could have served as music during the distribution of communion in a French mass.

\*OPENING PRAYER

All: Almighty God, we long for peace in our world and in our lives. In this season of Advent, prepare us to receive anew your Son, our Savior, and grant us the blessing of peaceful spirits, that we might serve your peace in our days. For we ask in Jesus' name. Amen.

One: In the days of exile and uncertainty, the prophet Isaiah cried out: O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence. As when fire sets twigs ablaze and causes water to boil, come down to make your name known to your enemies and cause the nations to quake before you! For when you did awesome things that we did not expect, you came down, and the mountains trembled before you. In the midst of our own encounters with uncertainty and upheaval and our longing for deliverance, Jesus calls to us, "Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come."

# ALL: We wait as people surprised again and again by God, who shakes us out of our complacency and wakes us up to the work of the kin-dom all around us.

One: We light this candle as a sign of our shocking hope. May we stay awake to God's activity in the world as we wait in expectation that even now God is with us, working to restore us to the fullness of life with God and one another. Amen.

### THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

### Isaiah 40:1-11

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. <sup>2</sup> Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. <sup>3</sup> A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. <sup>4</sup> Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. <sup>5</sup> Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." <sup>6</sup> A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. <sup>7</sup> The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. <sup>8</sup> The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever. <sup>9</sup> Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" <sup>10</sup> See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. "He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

One: May God bless the reading of the Word.

ALL: Thanks be to God.



Closing Voluntary

Passacaglia in D Minor, BuxWV 161

Dietrich Buxtehude (1637-1707)

A passacaglia is a musical form in a triple meter that features a repeating pedal ostinato. In Buxtehude's Passacaglia, there are four sections, exploring a total of three keys. The first section is in D minor (the tonic), the second in F major (the relative major), the third in A minor (the dominant), and the fourth returns to D minor. The sections are connected by short modulatory passages, and each section contains seven variations on the seven-note ostinato. Buxtehude was based in the city of Lübeck in Northern Germany, to where a young J.S. Bach famously traveled (250 miles) to study with the great master. Bach later wrote his own staggering Passacaliga. This piece grows and transforms with each repetition of the pedal ostinato, not unlike how we in the church are transformed during our journey through the dark expectation of Advent into the light of Christmas.




