

With compassion, respect, and confidentiality, our Lay Ministers prepare for this ministry through intensive training over a ten-week period, with supervision and clinical practice in partnership with the chaplains of Wesley Woods Senior Living and the Reverends Karen Kagiyama and Kevin Lazarus. They also receive continuing instruction and supervision in monthly group sessions led by the Reverends John Patton and Woody Spackman. In partnership with the clergy, their ministry includes prayer, hospital and home visitation, grief and caregiver support, as well as participation in Glenn's Homebound Communion and Prayer Shawl ministries.

Henri Mulet (1878-1967)

The Esquisses Byzantines ("Byzantine Sketches") were composed by french organist Henri Mulet between 1914-1919. Each movement of the ten sketches was inspired by or dedicated to a specific part of the Sacré-Coeur Basilica in Paris, or to a liturgical function for which the church is used. The second sketch, "Vitrail," is inspired by the basilica's stained glass and depicts sunlight streaming into a sacred space.

# ■ We Hear God's Word

The First Lesson

Nehemiah 8:1, 5-6, 8-10

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had given to Israel. <sup>5</sup> And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. <sup>6</sup> Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen', lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshipped the Lord with their faces to the ground. <sup>8</sup> So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. <sup>9</sup> And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, 'This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep.' For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. <sup>10</sup> Then he said to them, 'Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.'

Luke 4:14-21

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. <sup>15</sup> He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. <sup>16</sup> When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, <sup>17</sup> and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: <sup>18</sup> 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, <sup>19</sup> to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.' <sup>20</sup> And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the

attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. <sup>21</sup> Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'





Bach was inspired by the Italian style in composing his musical setting of the Creed. This trio sonata combines the non-relenting, interweaving lines in the hands with a repeating ascending ostinato in the pedals. The alternating pattern in the feet could signify firm steps on the path up to heaven, or perhaps the confidence brought about by healthy faith in God.
