

Rachel Laurin (1961-2023)

This "square" fugue is thus named probably due to its subject, which you will hear is steadily distributed between short ideas, one for each side of a square. The piece is marked at a *mezzo piano* dynamic (moderately soft), and the composer explores different chromatic variations on the original theme, as countersubjects weave in and out of the texture. Rachel Laurin was a fabulous composer and organist who passed away last August.

THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. ² Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; ³ but anyone who loves God is known by him.

⁴ Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." ⁵ Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords— ⁶ yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

⁷ It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. ⁸ "Food will not bring us close to God." We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. ⁹ But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰ For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? ¹¹ So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. ¹² But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³ Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.



CLOSING VOLUNTARY

Fugue Triangulaire Rachel Laurin

This fugue has an entirely different manner (and shape) from that heard as our prelude this morning, as it is based in a world of three rather than four. While a duple meter (or a feeling of being "in four") can be likened to our own heartbeats, a triple meter is less stable and tends to evoke dance patterns, such as a waltz or, in this case, a gigue. In addition, this "triangle" fugue is marked *non legato* and *forte* (loud); the difference in touch and registration helps represent a more celebratory tone. Once again, Laurin uses her skill in counterpoint and varying textures in this music.
