Praeludium Francis Jackson (1917-2022)

Francis Jackson passed away this year on January 10th at the amazing age of 104. He served as Director of Music at York Minster from 1946 to 1982 and was the student and successor to Sir Edward Bairstow. This "Praeludium" sounds like something J. S. Bach might have produced, had he lived in 20th-century England rather than in Germany during the Late Baroque period. The music has a similar texture to some of Bach's chorale preludes, and the piece was written in Leipzig in the tercentenary of Bach's birth (1985).

Luke 4:21-30

²¹ Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." ²² All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" ²³ He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." ²⁴ And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's hometown. ²⁵ But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; ²⁶ yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon.

²⁷ There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." ²⁸ When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. ²⁹ They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. ³⁰ But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

Carillon de Longpont

Louis Vierne (1870-1937)

Perhaps not as well-known as his other Carillon (de Westminster), Vierne's Carillon de Longpont is still bombastic and energetic. The theme (heard first in the pedals and later in the manuals) comes from the carillon pattern heard at the chapel of the Château de Longpont, about an hour and a half drive northeast of Paris, in Aisne. The bell tower of the church was destroyed in 1917 and only partially reconstructed six years later; there now exists an official group (Association for the Restitution of the Chimes of Longpont) with the sole objective of restoring the original chime pattern that aligns with Vierne's music.
