OPENING VOLUNTARY

Allein Gott in der Höh' sei Ehr' ("All Glory be to God on High"), BWV 711

The chorale Allein Gott in der Höh sei Ehr' is the Lutheran paraphrase of the Gloria in excelsis. This setting's form is called a bicinium (or duo): the hymn sounds as a soprano solo above an agile bass line, which could have been played by a gamba or even a low woodwind instrument. This setting is one of ten that Bach composed on this specific chorale tune, which is commonly associated with cheerful praise of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

*Affirmation of Faith The Nicene Creed

ALL: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. 
