

Scherzoso, from Sonata 8, Op. 132

Josef Rheinberger (1839-1901)

This movement comes from one of Rheinberger's 20 organ sonatas. He hoped to eventually write a total of 24 sonatas, each in a different key, in an effort to emulate J. S. Bach in his masterwork, the Well-Tempered Clavier. "Scherzoso" translates to "playful," but you will also hear elements reminiscent of a storm, rising in intensity.
