

This is the first piece in Brahms' final composition: a collection of 11 chorale preludes for the organ. It is very likely that at the time of writing, the composer was already aware of his illness and proximity to death. He had also just suffered the lost of his close friend, Clara Schumann. You will hear the chorale tune in the pedals, underneath a fugal texture in the hands.

# THE SECOND LESSON Romans 5:12-19

Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, and so death spread to all because all have sinned—<sup>13</sup> sin was indeed in the world before the law, but sin is not reckoned when there is no law. <sup>14</sup> Yet death exercised dominion from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sins were not like the transgression of Adam, who is a type of the one who was to come.

<sup>15</sup> But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died through the one man's trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the free gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many. <sup>16</sup> And the free gift is not like the effect of the one man's sin. For the judgement following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brings justification. <sup>17</sup> If, because of the one man's trespass, death exercised dominion through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness exercise dominion in life through the one man, Jesus Christ.

<sup>18</sup> Therefore just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. <sup>19</sup> For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.



British musician John Sanders was closely associated with Gloucester Cathedral, having served it as Assistant Organist from the late '50s and returning as Director of Music from 1967 to 1994. His Toccata was written for inclusion in an Organ Album featuring works by former organists of the cathedral, including Samuel Sebastian Wesley, Herbert Brewer, and Herbert Sumsion. Its modal harmonies and repetitive phrases gradually devolve into wilder sonances.
