

Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck (1562-1621)

Sweelinck was employed by the city of Amsterdam for more than forty years as organist of the Oude Kerk and leader of the Amsterdam Collegium Musicum. He was called "the Amsterdam Orpheus" by his contemporaries, after the musician from Greek mythology. As an organist, much of what Sweelinck played arose from improvisation. His notated keyboard music is sometimes the result of this. This piece is based on John Dowland's doleful song (originally for lute) "Flow my Teares." There are three sections, each of which is repeated with embellishments and subtle variations in the harmony to heighten the expressive effect. This same song was also famously adapted to keyboard by English composer William Byrd.

*THE GOSPEL LESSON

John 12:20-33

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²² Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³ Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵ Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

²⁷ "Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." ²⁹ The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." ³⁰ Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. ³¹ Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³ He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.


There is a Balm in Gilead

CLOSING VOLUNTARY

Voluntary in D minor, Op. 5 no. 6

John Stanley (1712-86)

Virtually blind from the age of two after an accident in his early years, John Stanley was an accomplished organist, harpsichordist, and violinist, who attracted the attention and admiration of other composers of the time, including Maurice Greene and G. F. Handel. Stanley also became the youngest person ever to receive the Bachelor of Music degree from Oxford, at age seventeen. In 1734, at the age of 22, Stanley was appointed as the organist at the Temple Church in London. He held this prestigious position for over 50 years, during which he gained renown for his remarkable performances and compositions. This Voluntary is in two parts; after a somber opening marked for "Diapasons" (or in the case of our Casavant, the Great's "Montre" stop), there follows lively figuration from a solo "Cornet" sound, perhaps meant to imitate a trumpeter.
