Paul Creston (1906-1985)

The son of Italian immigrants, Paul Creston (born Giuseppe Guttoveggio) was largely self-taught, although he did study piano, violin, and organ with the composer Pietro Yon. Creston helped support his musical studies through various jobs, including working as a theatre organist for silent movies in New York City. He also served as organist of St. Malachy's Church in New York from 1934 to 1967. An excerpt from his personal Creed states, "To me, musical composition is as vital to my spiritual welfare as prayer and good deeds just as good food and exercise are necessities of physical health, and [thought] and study are [requisites] of mental well-being."

THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

The Rev. Kevin Lazarus

Galatians 5:1, 13-25

¹ For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

¹³For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. ¹⁴ For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ¹⁵ If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

¹⁶ Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷ For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. ¹⁹ Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, ²⁰ idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, ²¹ envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

²² By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. 24And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.


