This short but beautiful piece was written in 1953 for inclusion in a book of harmony exercises given as a retirement gift to Jean Gallon, Duruflé's harmony teacher at the Paris Conservatoire. Gallon encouraged his students to embrace 'the flavor of modality so characteristic of modern French music,' and Duruflé's own music certainly does this, by combining the modal textures of chant-based music with colorful and profound harmonies.


Magnificat in C
