#### A Meditation on 'Brother James's Air'

Harold Darke (1888-1976)

Harold Darke studied composition with Charles V. Stanford at the Royal College of Music in London. For fifty years he worked as Organist and Director of Music at the London church St. Michael's, Cornhill. At St. Michael's, Darke began the longest-running organ recital series in the world which continues today, featuring weekly Monday afternoon concerts offered by local musicians (and sometimes even by young American organists...!). This gorgeous piece is based on the beautiful hymn tune written by 'Brother' James McBain, commonly used to paraphrase Psalm 23. This piece was also featured as part of the prelude to Queen Elizabeth's state funeral last year.


