Larghetto from Sonata for Organ, Op. 86

Vincent Persichetti (1915-87)

Vincent Persichetti was a virtuoso, both as a pianist and an organist, and he was an accomplished composer, as well as a teacher. Over the course of a 40-year tenure at the Juilliard School in New York City, Persichetti mentored many of the most accomplished composers of the latter half of the 20th century. In 1944, Persichetti offered 20 organ recitals at his church, Arch Street Presbyterian in Philadelphia, where he improvised on all 150 psalm texts. This middle movement from the Organ Sonata (1960) is pensive and beautiful, even if its mid-century harmonies might seem a bit foreign at first hearing.

THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

Sarah Perkins

Hebrews 12:18-29

¹⁸ You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, ¹⁹ and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. ²⁰(For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." ²¹ Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") ²² But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, ²³ and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, ²⁴ and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. ²⁵ See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven!

²⁶ At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." ²⁷ This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. ²⁸ Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; ²⁹ for indeed our God is a consuming fire.


I Lift My Eyes

Josef Seeger was the organist of the Kreuzherrenkirche in Prague from 1745 until his death. He was the most prolific Czech organ composer of the 18th century. Both of these movements are rather short, possibly due to limitations on acceptable length of voluntaries in the Catholic liturgy of that time.
