

### On December 26, 1747, John Wesley strongly urged the Methodists to renew their covenant with God.

His first Covenant Service was held on August 11, 1755. He issued this as a pamphlet in 1780 and the form was used without alterations for nearly a century. After that, various modifications were made from time to time. This service is edited to make it more understandable to contemporary minds and hearts. This service has been a blessing to Methodists since 1755!

### Reaffirmation of Faith

Bishop Robin Dease, Resident Bishop, North Georgia Episcopal Area of The United Methodist Church

One: Sisters and brothers in Christ: through the sacrament of baptism God's Spirit has been poured out upon us-water poured over and immersing us, water that flows freely for all who will receive it, water from the streams of God's saving power and justice, water that brings hope to all who thirst for righteousness, water that refreshes life, nurtures growth, and offers new birth. Today we come to the waters, to renew our commitments to Christ who has raised us, the Spirit who has birthed us, and the Creator who is making all things new. And so I ask you, will you turn away from the powers of sin and death?

#### ALL: We renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of our sin.

- One: Will you let the Holy Spirit use you as prophets to the powers that be?
- ALL: We accept the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.
- One: Will you proclaim the good news and live as disciples of Jesus Christ, his body on earth?
- ALL: We confess Jesus Christ as our Savior, put our whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as our Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races.
- One: Will you be living witnesses to the gospel, individually and together, wherever you are, and in all that you do?
- ALL: We will remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world.
- One: Will you receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?
- ALL: We affirm and teach the faith of the whole church as we put our trust in God, the Father Almighty, in Jesus Christ, his only Son, and in the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever.
- One: The Spirit of the Lord is with us.

#### ALL: Even so, come, Lord Jesus!

One: Let us pray. Almighty God, the life you birthed in us by baptism into Jesus Christ will never die. Your justice never fails. Your mercy is everlasting. Your healing river flows. Your Spirit blows where you will. We cannot stop you, God! But sometimes we try. We try to block the flow, we redirect the winds of the Spirit, or we walk so far away from the life-giving Stream that we do not hear its sound, and we forget its power. We parch ourselves. We are dry and thirsty, O God.

#### ALL: Come, refresh us.

One: Let these waters be to us drops of your mercy. Let these waters remind us of your righteousness and justice. Let these waters renew in us the resurrection power of Jesus. Let these waters make us long for your coming reign. Eternal God, One in Three and Three in One!

### ALL: All glory is yours, now and forever. Amen!

### COVENANT SERVICE

One: Let us gathered here before the Lord now in covenant commit ourselves to Christ as his servants. Let us give ourselves to him so that we may fully belong to him. Jesus Christ has left us with many services to be done. Some of these services are easy and honorable, but some are difficult and disgraceful. Some line up with our desires and interests; others are contrary to both. In some we please both Christ and ourselves, but there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves. Jesus Christ, we offer you this prayer:

# ALL: Let me be your servant. Let me follow your commands. I will no longer follow my own desires. I give myself completely to your will.

- One: The power and strength to live as true servants is given to us in Christ. We accept the place and work he gives us, acknowledging that he alone will be our reward.
- ALL: I am not my own. I am yours alone. Make me into what you will. Rank me with those you will. Put me to use for you. Put me to suffering for you. Let me be employed for you. Let me be laid aside for you. Let me be lifted high for you. Let me be brought low for you. Let me be full or let me be empty. Let me have all things or let me have nothing. With a willing heart, I freely give everything to your pleasure and disposal.
- One: Christ is Savior to those who are his true servants. He is the source of all salvation to those who obey. To be his servant is to consent fully to his will. Christ accepts nothing less. Christ will be all in all, or he will be nothing. Let us pray together:
- ALL: My righteous God, for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, see me now as I fall down before you. Forgive my unfaithfulness when I have not done your will. You promise mercy if I turn to you with my whole heart.

- One: God requires that you rid yourself of every idol in your life.
- ALL: From the bottom of my heart, I here and now renounce every idol in my life, covenanting with you that I will not commit any known sin. By turning against your will, I have turned my love toward the world. In your power I will watch for any temptation that will lead me away from you.
- One: Through Jesus Christ, God offers to be your God again, if you allow him to be.
- ALL: Before all heaven and earth, I here and now acknowledge you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as my Lord and God. I vow to give all of myself, body and soul, to be your servant and to serve you in holiness and righteousness all the days of my life.
- One: Jesus Christ is the only way and means to God. God has given us Jesus as the way and means to salvation.
- ALL: Jesus, I here and now accept you as the only new and living Way. I join myself in covenant with you. With all my power, I accept you as my Lord and Head. I renounce my own unworthiness and vow that you are the Lord, my righteousness. I renounce my own wisdom and take you for my only guide. I renounce my own will and take your will as my law.
- One: God has given holy laws as the rule of your life.
- ALL: I hear and now willingly take on your yoke and burden. All your laws are holy, just, and good. I accept them as the rule for my words, thoughts, and actions. I will strive to order my whole life around your will and love.
- One: The Almighty God searches and knows you, even the thoughts of your heart.
- ALL: O God, you know that we have made this covenant today in sincerity, without deceit or reluctance. If you find anything false in us, guide us and help us to set it right. O mighty God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, you have now become my Covenant Friend. And I, through your infinite grace, have become your covenant servant. You are mine and I am yours. So be it. May this covenant that I make here on earth be ratified in heaven. Amen.


### OFFERTORY A Covenant Prayer
