

Cantilena in G, Op. 71, No. 1

Arthur Foote (1853-1937)

This tranquil piece is written in a similar texture to Bach's famous "Air on the G String," with its beautiful melody soaring over gently pulsing chords in the accompaniment. However, it is set in a more modern idiom, given Foote's context within the American Romantic era. Foote was based in Boston at First Church (Unitarian) for over 30 years, and he also helped to found the American Guild of Organists in 1896.


